Donation of 1,400 computers BGL BNP Paribas supports social inclusion and the circular economy

With a view to promoting social inclusion and the circular economy, BGL BNP Paribas has donated 1,400 of its used desktop and laptop computers to two charities specialised in giving a new life to IT hardware and getting people in to work: Digital Inclusion and Ecodair.

After being cleaned and wiped of their data by BNP Paribas Group volunteers working on the *1MillionHours2Help* programme, these computers will be reconditioned by or for individuals who are struggling.

What next?

By recycling this computer equipment, the two recipient charities will enable vulnerable individuals to get back on their feet through work and access to computers - an essential part of economic and social reinsertion.

Patrick de la Hamette, chairman of Digital Inclusion, was delighted with "this gift of computers – the biggest donation that Digital Inclusion has ever received. It's a great opportunity. Given the current events in Ukraine and large number of refugees arriving in Luxembourg, this computer equipment will be more useful than ever".

According to Isabelle Pélissié du Rausas, Head of Sales at Ecodair, "this donation supports the creation of long-term jobs for the disabled people working for us and those looking to get back into work; it will also enable us to further our commitment to narrowing the digital divide. At Ecodair, we really believe in the establishment of meaningful partnerships like this one, based on the key issues of the circular economy and getting vulnerable or disabled individuals into the workplace".

As vital components of sustainable finance, social inclusion and the circular economy are an integral part of BGL BNP Paribas' strategy. Béatrice Belorgey, Chair of the BGL BNP Paribas Executive Committee, said: "By giving a second life to our computers, we help make IT equipment accessible to those who need it in their daily life while limiting the environmental impact".

Digital Inclusion (www.digital-inclusion.lu) is a non-profit organisation created in 2016 with the aim of helping people in Luxembourg who are excluded from the digital world. In addition to digital inclusion, the project promotes the circular economy and use of digital resources to facilitate social inclusion in Luxembourg.

16 employees and numerous volunteers work at the Luxembourg City site and provide services and lessons in different languages, including those spoken by refugee communities in Luxembourg, such as Tigrinya, Arabic, Persian and more recently Ukrainian. Classes have been taken by more than 2,000 people and include digital literacy, digital citizenship in Luxembourg, and computer-assisted language learning.



The bank for a changing world Within the field of the circular economy, the interactive and educational computer re-use workshop has reconditioned more than 4,000 computers and hundreds of smartphones. Devices have been distributed to those in need (in Luxembourg), in conjunction with social partners.

Since 2022 the project has been financed by the Ministry of Family Affairs, Integration and the Greater Region.
